Trace works in the studio and often shares our meals when he is here. Midas comes and goes. Mede usually works from a distance, but interacts frequently with Jonathan and with Hanc (the national brother helping with translation from afar). The drought is deep in their hearts, too. And these are only a few.....

But God is good. He is good and just in all He does. When He sends rain, and when He withholds it. Hallelujah.
